

2026-2027 Petition for Independent Status

SUBMISSION DEADLINE: APRIL 17th FOR PROCESSING TIME. ANY APPEALS SUBMITTED AFTER THIS DATE MAY NOT BE PROCESSED BY MAY 1ST. If you have accepted admission, you can continue to submit the appeal on your Bruin Financial Aid Portal.

Purpose

This form is used to gather information regarding unusual circumstances that warrant the re-evaluation of your dependency status. In order to make exceptions to federal/state regulations, your appeal must be detailed and provide accurate verifiable documentation. Please only submit this petition if you have already completed and submitted your 2026-2027 FAFSA or Dream Act application. If your petition is denied, you will be instructed to provide parental information on your FAFSA or Dream Act application.

Policies

This appeal is for students who have unusual circumstances that prevent them from contacting their parents or contacting their parents might pose a risk to the students

You may be experiencing unusual circumstances if you:

- Left home due to an abusive or threatening environment;
- Are abandoned by or estranged from your parents;
- Have refugee or asylee status and are separated from your parents, or your parents are displaced in a foreign country;
- Are a victim of human trafficking;
- Are incarcerated, or your parents are incarcerated, and contact with them would pose a risk to the you; or
- Are otherwise unable to contact or locate your parents.

The following circumstances are not unusual circumstances and will require parental information on FAFSA or Dream Act application:

- Parents refusing to contribute to college education
- Parents unwilling to provide information on your financial aid application (i.e. FAFSA or California Dream Act Application);
- Parents do not claim student on income taxes
- Student is financially independent of parents

**The California Child Abuse and Neglect Reporting Act ("CANRA"), codified at California Penal Code §§ 11164-11174.3, requires that employers of Mandated Reporters (as defined in the Act) promote identification and reporting of child abuse or neglect. Section D: Signature and certification statement

Please sign and return this completed form and all supporting documentation to the Financial Aid & Scholarships office. Failure to do so will delay your financial aid process. Unsigned or incomplete forms will not be processed.

I understand that purposely falsifying information may lead to cancellation of my aid and prevent me from receiving financial aid in future academic years.
